OUR WORK

Since 1974, the Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter has helped more than **240,000** individuals impacted by family violence and abuse in our community. Although the Emergency Shelter is the cornerstone of our agency, it is "**More than a Shelter**", providing a number of innovative safety, prevention and healing programs which support individuals and families build safe lives and healthy relationships, as well as, engaging the community in dialogue about family violence and abuse.

CEO & PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

2020 was a year like no other, bringing with it challenges as well as opportunities no one could have ever imagined. COVID-19 has become part of our daily lives and this pandemic has forced all of us to change quickly and often.

As everyone came to grips with what was happening and public health restrictions were put in place, demand for our programs and services came to a stand-still in the first weeks of the pandemic. Access to the people and supports for those impacted by family violence and abuse were now out of reach. Overnight, we were no longer able to support our clients, face-to-face across our agency.

The Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter has always been a symbol of safety and hope, providing support during dangerous situations and in crisis. The individuals and families we serve were dealing with changing community context and uncertainty, changing family dynamics and increased levels of violence and danger, and needed somewhere to turn.

To serve the needs of our community during this unprecedented time, we had to adjust to the changes, and to the way we do business. Whether it was a victim, friends or family looking to support someone, or men or youth looking for help, we continued to support those experiencing family violence and abuse.

We refocused our services and outreach strategies to ensure our programs remained accessible. We moved our services online to provide support virtually, and added capacity to prepare for higher demand. As the COVID-19 situation unfolded, we saw our demand move up and down, and we hit new highs and spikes in service demand.

As the anxiety of the pandemic and economic uncertainty remains, we continue to look at innovative ways to provide our services and reach out to our community, as well as engage with our partners to help prevent family violence and abuse. As needs change and the complexity of the issue increases, we continue to adapt.

Even in these uncertain times, we have a renewed sense of optimism. Our agency is committed to ongoing improvement and finding new ways to ensure we are a healthy, vibrant and informed organization. To help guide our activities and aspirations over the next three years, we launched our 2020-2023 Strategic Plan, *Standing for Change*, laying out a foundation for focused operations and practice.

This plan will continue the great work and the strides made from the previous strategic plan. We are drawing upon our legacy as a leader in our field, strengthening our partnerships, continuing to build collaborative relationships and leveraging our expertise. As we look ahead, we will continue to partner with diverse stakeholders, including a commitment to engage with the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Report.

The demanding work of our agency, especially during this critical time is made possible because of the unwavering commitment from our funders, donors, supporters, partners, volunteers and staff. Thank you for your generous and ongoing support.

This next year will remain difficult, but we go into it wiser and stronger. We are inspired by the resilience of those we serve and of our community, and are hopeful looking forward.

PET FRIENDLY ROOMS: SHELTER FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

Pets can often be a significant barrier to women leaving a dangerous and abusive situation. Victims will delay leaving or may consider returning to their partner because they fear for the safety of their pets. Many women are unaware that there are options for keeping their pets safe while finding safety for themselves and their children. In June 2020, two rooms in our Emergency Shelter were transformed to accommodate small animals that arrive with women escaping violence. Allowing pets in the Shelter helps provide emotional and healing support for women and their children during their stay, and can be life changing in their journey. This program honours Jasmine Lovett and Aliyah Sanderson, a mother and daughter who lost their lives to violence.

NEW INITIATIVES

MEN HELPING MEN CAMPAIGN

We launched this new initiative to help fund our Men's Counselling Service in the Fall of 2020. We enlisted the help of core supporters to reach out to their personal networks to help support this important program. Community members took part to create videos to help shine a light on the importance of working with men in addressing family violence and abuse. This first year was a great success, raising close to \$100,000.

SHELTER BEDS APP

In the Spring of 2020, we launched the Shelter Beds App in collaboration with YW Calgary, Rowan House, Wheatland Shelter and Awo Taan Healing Lodge Society. This Shelter Beds App is a useful tool which allows local emergency shelters to share information on vacancies with each other and keep room availability up-to-date, creating a smoother process for women seeking shelter. This app has been very successfully utilized and is being piloted shortly in some other communities in Alberta. The vision is for this app to be deployed across the province to assist the larger shelter system be better able to respond to community need for beds province wide and regionally.

MEN'S DIGITAL STRATEGY

This is a digital presence that will offer healthy, well founded support, information and help for men looking to build healthy strong families and relationships. It will be paired with a men's helpline and will be the first of a kind initiative in Canada. This exciting new initiative will be launched in 2021.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Last year I ended my report reflecting on the significant uncertainty caused by the early days of the pandemic, specifically as it related to the capacity of our community to support the agency during a lockdown that was having such a detrimental economic and social impact on so many individuals and organizations across Calgary. To say that we've been overwhelmed with the level of support we've received would be a distinct understatement.

We started the year with the disappointment of having to cancel our annual Turning Points Fundraising Gala. However, the response from our current donors, supporters and the broader community was far more than we could have expected at this critical time. As a result, we ended the year with donor and event revenue of almost \$5.7 million, which was unexpected but extremely welcome.

We were also fortunate to receive significant support from all levels of government, and in particular through the Federal Government's Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) program, and this, coupled with higher than expected donor and event revenue and a tight management of our costs, allowed the organization to deliver a surplus in the year of \$2.7 million.

Although we anticipate the next year to be challenging, we made a decision to use the revenue towards much needed repairs and upgrades to our Emergency Shelter facility and to expand our service capability with operating costs expected to be 9% higher in 2021-2022. We know the need is there at levels never seen before and we now have the financial capacity to enhance our already considerable influence and counselling footprint.

Our city has been significantly impacted in so many areas during the pandemic, and a rise in incidents of family violence and abuse has been a consequence of the anxieties created within families during these unique and extremely challenging times. The agency's services have never been more in demand and the exceptional level of contributions from our supporters this year allows us to continue our programs and services for those impacted by family violence and abuse.

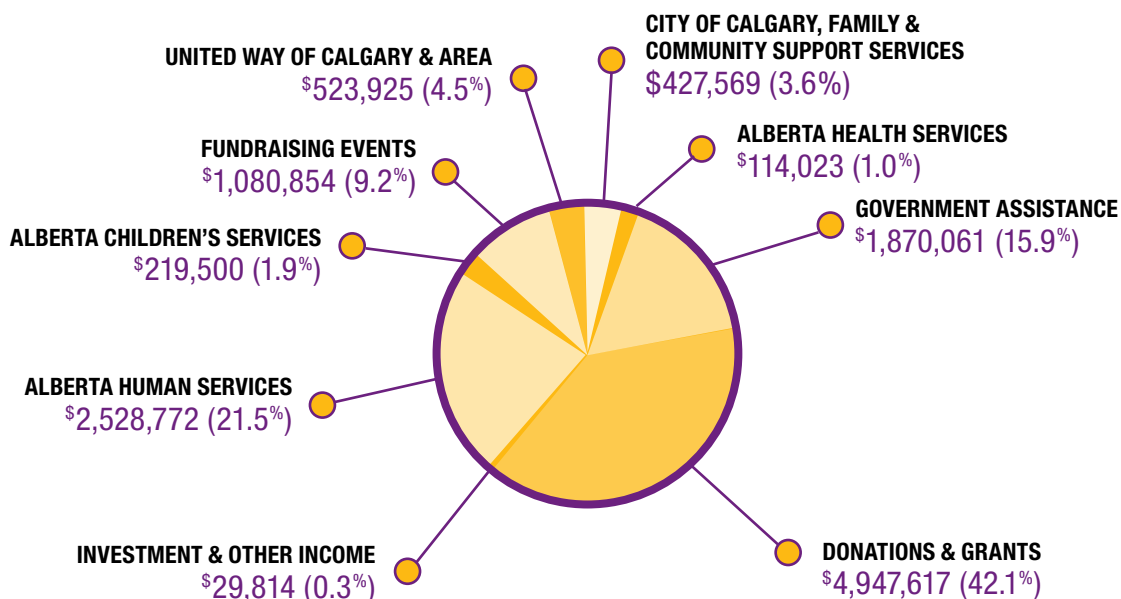

FISCAL PERIOD ENDED MARCH 31, 2021

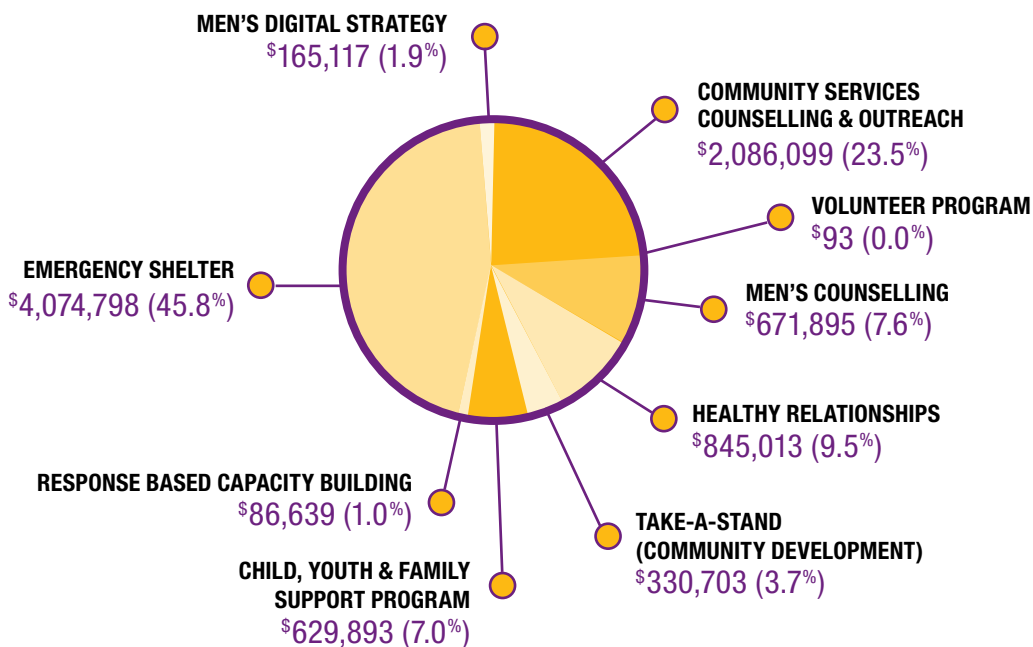
FUNDING SOURCES 2020 – 2021
